EMERGENCY CLOSURE OF SCHOOL

On very rare occasions our school might have to close, either partially or completely. The most likely reason for this would be due to snow or problems associated with adverse weather. Any decision to close our school will be based first and foremost on the safety and welfare of our children and staff. Such decisions are taken with the upmost consideration for health and safety and the minimising of risk.

If a full or partial closure is necessary, we will do the following:

- Notify the Local Authority, who should add the information to their website (www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/schoolclosures);
- Send a message via the TXTRound text-messaging system;
- Notify our two local radio stations, BBC Radio Lincolnshire and Lincs FM, who will announce that we are closed
- (it should also appear on their websites);
- Post a notice outside our school (if it is safe for someone to do so).

DATA PROTECTION

Today you should receive a copy of our Privacy Notice which relates to the Data Protection Act (1998). This is the Privacy Notice approved by Lincolnshire County Council for Local Authority schools such as ours. This is just to remind everyone of current legislation in readiness for it being updated and superseded by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) which applies from 25th May 2018, bringing with it new elements and significant enhancements to ensure it is fit for purpose in today's data-rich world.

THANK YOU TO THE JANE PALMER FOUNDATION

We are once again extremely grateful to the Jane Palmer Foundation for their extremely generous donation to the school. The Jane Palmer Foundation is a registered charity which aims to provide income for students at College, University & Further Education for residents of Burgh-le-Marsh up to the age of 25. It's constitution also allows donations to the local C of E School. The money is provided from rent income from a parcel of land left for this purpose. According to White's Lincolnshire Directory from 1872, Palmers Grammar School was founded in 1726 by Jane Palmer of Newark, who bequeathed to the Vicars of Burgh-Croft and Wainfleet for that purpose approximately 28 acres of rich marsh land. We are obviously planning to spend their donation in a way which will benefit the children of our school and will, of course, let everyone know when we have done so!
