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## **OFSTED INSPECTION UPDATE**

By now you will have read the outcome of our Ofsted inspection back in February. It is on the Ofsted website and our school website. As a school we are happy that it accurately refects where we are at the moment. Because it is five years since the school last received a two-day inspection (know as Section 5), Ofsted are due to visit us again anytime from Term 5 onwards for two days to see how we are getting on.

#### **SPORT NEWS**

The first three months of 2018 have been very busy where sport at our school is concerned. Back in January and February, children from Y5 and Y6 took part in the Aquasplash Swimming Gala at the Meridian Leisure Centre in Louth. Children from Key Stage One also took part in a Multi-Skills Festival and children from across the school competed in a 'Speed, Agility and Quickness' event, both held at Skegness Grammar School.

This term, having previously taken part in a Talent Day at Skegness Grammar School, our Y6 High 5 mixed netball squad subsequently finished as runners up in the local area competition, leading to them competing at the County Finals at the Mears Leisure Centre in Grantham.

In Hockey, our school recently took part in the area Y5/6 Quicksticks competition for the first time. Clearly the day spent with Olympic Team GB Hockey player Sally Walton (who visited our school on 27<sup>th</sup> February) had a huge impact on Y5 and Y6. Our two Y5 teams narrowly missed out on the top spots during their event, with 'Burgh 1' missing out by a single goal and 'Burgh 2' finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> - one point behind the eventual winners (Woodhall). The Y6 teams were just as impressive. 'Burgh 4' finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in their event, whilst 'Burgh 3' dominated proceedings and are now waiting to play Woodhall for a place in the County Finals.

Last week ten children from Key Stage 2 were invited to take part in a Multi-Skills Talent Day at SGS. Well done to all children who have represented the school in so many different sporting event so far this year - we are very proud of you all. Thank you also to parents and friends of the school for your sporting support!
